Project Vision:

An exciting project to restore Lichfield's historic city centre parks. In October 2008 the partnership submitted their stage two application for the £3.919 million (including Professional Fees) that has been ring-fenced by the Heritage Lottery Fund and Big Lottery for the implementation of the project. If successful, we hope that restoration works will start in 2009 and finish in 2010. The project will see a new café and a refreshment kiosk, toilets, a much improved playground facility, and a new bowls pavilion added to Beacon Park. The main pavilion will also be extended to house improved football changing facilities and new offices for the parks staff. Crucial conservation work to listed structures, including Beacon Park's statues, balustrades and fountain, and the Garden of Remembrance's gate piers, balustrades and war memorial will also be carried out.

Altus Andrews have provided all Stage 2 cost planning services for the Heritage Lottery Fund bid. We are now in the process of compiling the Bills of Quantities as well as providing procurement advice in readiness for tender action. We are also commissioned to provide a full post – contract Quantity Surveying service.
