Project Vision:

Altus Andrews were appointed by Imperial College London to undertake the Quantity Surveying role in connection with the refurbishment and extension of three Grade II listed Lodge buildings within the grounds of Silwood Park in Ascot.

The project consisted of the complete refurbishment and extension of three original Grade II* listed lodges, designed by Alfred Waterhouse in the Victorian vernacular style and constructed circa 1876-8. Single storey contemporary extensions were added to the buildings to create three bed dwellings while ensuring no design confusion between the new and existing.

Altus Andrews were involved with the project from inception through to its completion in October 2008. The finished project has been completed to extremely high standards and required the whole project team to work closely monitoring the progress, quality and cost of the works ensuring a successful outcome for the client and conservation department.
